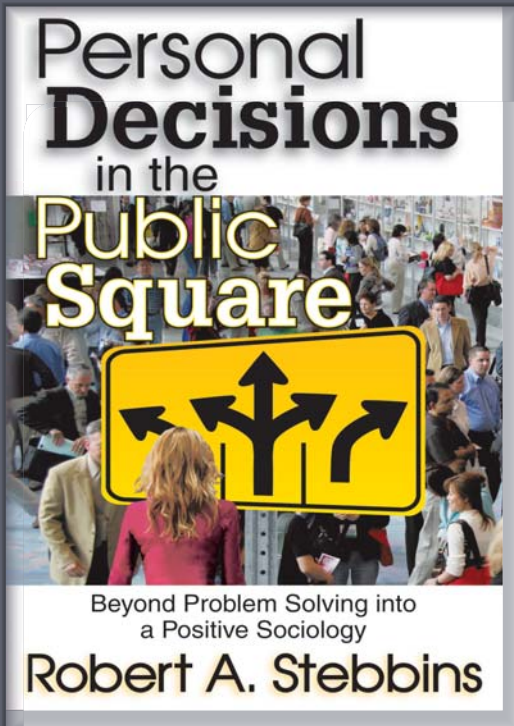

principal wellspring of *Personal Decisions in the Public Square* is, in large part, the sociology of leisure, a “happy science.” It is focused on the attractive side of life. For research scientists or the general public, the arguments presented may lead toward a better understanding of negotiating situations in a way that would be more positive than approaching them as “problems” which need to be solved. Robert A. Stebbins calls this “Positive Sociology.”

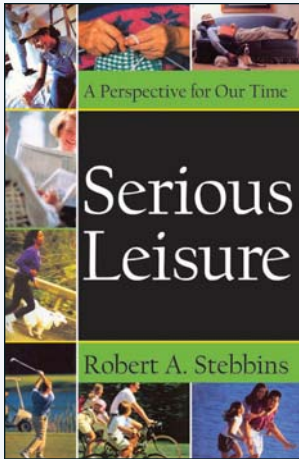

leisure perspective in a globalizing world and some of its critical links with other fields of knowledge and practice, notably the nonprofit sector and preventive medicine.

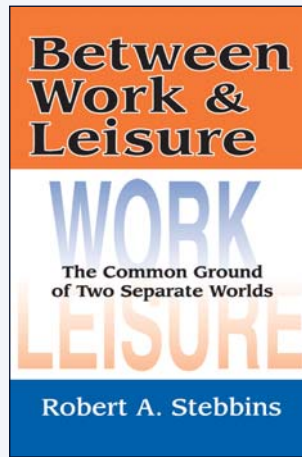
